- A comparison of attitudes toward Jews across several countries
- The number of hate crimes in the U.S. motivated by bias against different religions
- A comparison of hate crimes in the U.S. across different categories (e.g., race gender, religion)
- Knowledge of and attitudes about the Holocaust
- Types of antisemitic incidents in the U.S.

REPORT	DESCRIPTION
FBI Hate Crimes Statistics (2019)	This table shows the numbers of incidents, offenses, victims, and offenders for crimes motivated by bias in 2019. It reports incidents in the following categories: Race/Ethnicity/Ancestry, Religion, Sexual Orientation, Disability, Gender, and Gender identity.
CNN Poll: Antisemitism in Europe (2018)	This article reports results from a poll of more than 7,000 people across Europe, with more than 1,000 respondents each in Austria, France, Germany, Great Britain, Hungary, Poland, and Sweden. The poll cover topics including attitudes toward Jews, knowledge of the Holocaust, and the relationship between the Holocaust, Israel, Jews and antisemitism.
Audit of Anti-Semitic Incidents: Year in Review (2021)	ADL's (Anti-Defamation League) Center on Extremism tracks incidents of antisemitic harassment, vandalism, and assault in the United States. Incidents are reported by state/location and summarized over the past decade. Themes include antisemitism in K-12 schools, on college campuses, and in Jewish institutions; bomb threats; cemetery desecration; and incidents related to Israel and Zionism.
Antisemitism Monitor (2018-21)	This database reports antisemitic incidents around the world by country and date on a weekly basis. Incidents from 2018 to 2021 can be accessed.
ADL H.E.A.T. Map (2002-22)	This is an interactive map detailing incidents of hate, extremism, antisemitism, and terrorism around the U.S. ADL's Center on Extremism developed this visualization with data points taken from news and media reports, government documents, victim reports, and other sources.
