LILLIAN ECKSTEIN BIOGRAPHICAL PROFILE





Lillian Eckstein was born on March 22, 1926, in Nižní
Verecky, Czechoslovakia (now Nyzhni Vorota, Ukraine) to
parents Pinchas Mendelson and Miriam Rosenberg. She
grew up in a big family among three sisters: Ibi, Margaret,
and Ella, and three brothers: Gabriel, Jacob, and Menache.
When the Nazis invaded Czechoslovakia, Lillian and her
family were forced to live in the Mukačevo ghetto. She
was deported to Auschwitz II-Birkenau, a concentration
and death camp in Nazi-occupied Poland, and later
transported to Bergen-Belsen, a concentration camp in
Germany. There, she was liberated by British armed forces.
She immigrated to New York where she married Michael
Eckstein and had two daughters: Irene and Marilyn
Eckstein. This interview was conducted on February 26,
1995, in Rego Park, New York.
